# MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF



Dear Citizens,

We are proud to share our 2015 Annual Report with you. This report provides selected highlights of the many accomplishments, initiatives, and programs involving the dedicated men and women of the Cleburne Police Department. This report also includes a statistical review of reported crime, calls for service, traffic data, and crashes.

We achieved significant goals and initiated a number of special programs in 2015. We implemented a new annual in-service training program to provide our officers with state-of-the-art development addressing the complexities of 21st-century policing in a democratic society. The new training program has already been credited with saving two lives.

In pursuit of the "Recognized Law Enforcement Agency" award, we revised policies and prepared proofs of compliance for each of the Texas Law Enforcement Best Business Practices covering all aspects of law enforcement operations, including use of force, protection of citizen rights, vehicle pursuits, property and evidence management, and patrol and investigative operations. We were also the first agency in Johnson County to implement a bachelor's degree requirement for new recruits with no law enforcement or military experience.

Our crime and traffic crash rates continued to decline in 2015 to their lowest levels in nearly a decade. The Cleburne Police Department's successful implementation of the Data-Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Safety (DDACTS) operational model was included in an *Engaging Local Government Leaders* (ELGL.org) article about using data to fight crime. Thanks to the efforts of our hardworking team members and involved stakeholders, we have achieved a 32% reduction in major crime categories since 2012.







### ADULT ARRESTS BY YEAR
