

Jeff Cody our basketball coach at C.H.S. was tagged red handed with a *certain magazine* in his briefcase, by a number of his fellow teachers and students.




The Jackets built up a early lead and never let go. Led by senior runningback Tony Holbert, the Jackets running game never looked better. The Jackets scored first and last in the game as the score would indicate, 33-6. This game ended up to be one of the best Cleburne would play all year.

The Jackets faced the Marlin Bulldogs hoping for another win to up their record to 3-2. The 16th ranked team from Marlin and South Zone champs put up a good fight for the Jackets. The Jackets proved to be the better team in a 14 to 7 victory.



Jackets Post 5-5 Season





A Hard Fought Victorious End

Cleburne won the final game with a 7-6 victory over Everman. The game was hard fought to even the record at 5-5.


















Friendships among the teammates have developed over the past year. The wins and losses have brought the girls closer together as FRIENDS, not only as fellow athletes.










Records Are Set



























'Yapper' Turns Funny - - Draws Attention, Sales Up

The Feb. 7, 1979 issue of the Yellow Jacket Yapper, published by Cichborne High School journalism staff since 1938, bore its own obituary. The obituary listed as cause of death "Lack of interest." In an accompanying story by staff member Ronnie Gorman, a history of declining sales of the publication was given.

Out of a student body of 1,200 the average sale of papers sold is 300.

The Yapper staff would be glad to receive questions from you (students). The future of the Yapper is in your hands.

Its issues have been printed this school year. It is from excellent mechanics in layout, the illustrations contain outstanding writing and facts of good investigative reporting. An zest and enthusiasm for the school, its future journalism shows through.

Its traits can only be emulated by first rating and guidance. In this case the teacher is Clara Frost who came to CHS this year to

teach journalism. Compliments are due to parents of these students.

In the Feb. 7 issue is a story by Angie Eastus that discusses vandalism of school property and how it costs the students and taxpayers. The article echoes the feeling of pride that is found in most CHS students while chastising those few who would desecrate the facilities. Sports items, reports on school clubs, some original poetry and an article on the lack of scholarships available to girls were also in that issue.

The January 10 issue featured National Honor Society inductees on the front page. Inside was a distressing piece concerning a survey the Yapper staff had done concerning the inability of students and teachers alike to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

They found out of 23 students surveyed, only six could say the pledge. Only two of 11 teachers surveyed could say it correctly.

Principal John Woodruff said in an interview that steps are being taken to try and have the pledge recited with some regularity as a result of

the Yapper survey.

Another story in the same issue by Lydia Locklin concerned itself with CHS curriculum and whether or not it was adequate to prepare our students for college.

The band, Honeybees, the Singers, top 10 music and school clubs were discussed. The October 31 issue featured an article concerning federal aide and its effect on various parts of school life. A survey was made of school board members, teachers, administrators and a school that accepts no federal money.

The list of accomplishments of the Yapper staff this year could go on and on - BUT the students apparently were not interested in serious subjects and quality production. Mrs. Frost said, "The students did it may way for six issues, so I agreed to let them do it their way for one." That was the origin of the Jacket Lampoon published Feb. 16.

Prior to the publishing of the Lampoon, rumors ran rampant as to what it would contain. CHS

Principal John Woodruff checked the proposed copy. He completely disallowed at least one article. He required the deletion of several words which he said were in bad taste.

The desire to sell more than 300 papers were fulfilled. The Lampoon sold 700 copies.

Reactions were varied, some laughed, some fumed, some complimented.

The Lampoon was full of fun, light weight stories, nothing hard to read. A lot of group student's choices of paper teachers. CHS's resident English grammar expert opined a "who" that should have been a "whom". The articles and or photos used were offensive only if one wished to be offended. The drastic change of format created shock value.

Woodruff said in an interview while the staff was setting, "Yes, we will continue to have a school newspaper. It is a teaching tool - I don't think it will be another Lampoon."

It appears the problem is to find a happy medium between quality and nonsense.

















The Symphonic Band was chosen as Outstanding Band over 32 bands in all classifications.














